Role Purpose

- A deep and broad knowledge of current issues and best practice in education
- A capacity to integrate technology into effective classroom practice
- A thorough knowledge of current pedagogy and music practices
- An ability to work in a dynamic team
- Outstanding organisational skills, ability and stamina to work in multiple teaching and performance environments.
