

Year 7 students explore the Blue Mountains

Year 7 Meriden girls recently enjoyed a Geography excursion to the Blue Mountains. The day began with a guided tour by an Indigenous ranger through the national park. Highlights of the talk included viewing an emu egg and learning more about how the land is cared for and the variety of food sources within the surrounding bushland.

Students then embarked on a bushwalk through the World Heritage-listed national park, where they saw rock formations, waterfalls and an abundance of flora and fauna while learning how the mountains were formed. The girls also put into practice their Geography skills, had the opportunity to complete field sketching, and gained a greater understanding of how the NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service look after the Blue Mountains National Park.
