



Recognition of Prior Learning Policy

Source of Obligation	<p>Standard 2.3 of the National Code requires the School to have and implement a documented policy and process for assessing and recording recognition of prior learning (RPL), and granting and recording course credit, if the School intends to assess or grant course credit.</p> <p>The School's decision to assess RPL or grant course credit must preserve the integrity of the award to which it applies and comply with the requirements of the educational framework of the course.</p>
Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)	<p>RPL is an assessment process that involves an assessment of an international student's prior learning, including formal, informal and non-formal learning, to determine the learning outcome of an individual.</p>
Meriden School's Policy	<p>It is the School's policy that we do not assess or recognise prior learning of an international</p>

student for the purposes of enrolment in a course at the School. Course credit is not awarded as the differences between each country's education system can be too difficult to align. However, the Principal may exercise discretion in this matter within the parameters set by the New South Wales Education Standards Authority (NESA).

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
