

Service in action for Year 9 students

Year 9 Students thoughtfully engaged in the Good Neighbour Workshop with Compassion on Friday 28 February.

In Pastoral Time this year, Year 9 tutors are focusing on the concept of service with the students. This session with Compassion explored the nature and complexity of poverty. Specifically, they heard about some of the challenges that young pregnant women face living in poverty.

During the session, the girls discussed some important questions, like 'what is poverty?' and 'what does it feel like to live in poverty?'

Students wrote heartfelt letters to young mothers involved in the Compassion project and in a hands-on experience, they created hair ribbons and lapels to raise money for overseas Mothers and Bubs programs at one of their service sessions.

Over the course of this year, Year 9 will participate in a range of other service-based opportunities.
