Twelve enthusiastic readers from our Junior School, including nine Year 6 students and three Year 5 students, proudly represented our school at the annual Kids' Lit Quiz, hosted at William Clarke College.

Often described as the "sport of reading", the Kids' Lit Quiz challenges teams of four to answer 100 fast-paced questions across ten mystery categories, all centred around children's literature. This year's categories were wide-ranging and imaginative, including riddles, bridges, confectionery, big cats, Greek mythology, villains, poetry, and well-known book characters. Students were encouraged to think quickly and draw on a broad and diverse knowledge of books.
