Role Purpose

The role requires a collaborative spirit, commitment to pastoral care, and active participation in the broader life of the school.

Responsibilities

- Teach a range of Mathematics classes across Years 7–12, applying differentiated instruction to meet diverse learning needs and support academic growth
- Take responsibility for a pastoral care group, fostering students' emotional, social, and personal development
- Contribute positively and generously to the Mathematics team by sharing resources, pedagogical insights, and collaborative spirit
- Present prescribed curriculum using varied teaching techniques and materials tailored to student abilities and learning styles
- Develop students' interests and abilities through differentiated, structured and creative learning activities
- Guide classroom discussions and supervise student work to encourage critical thinking, collaboration, and independent learning
- Prepare, administer, and mark assessments; provide timely feedback and maintain accurate records of achievement, attendance, and pastoral care
- Engage respectfully and professionally with students, parents, and colleagues; discuss individual progress and collaborate with Student Counsellors and senior staff as needed
- Maintain discipline and contribute to a safe, inclusive, and respectful learning environment across classrooms and school spaces
- Support broader school life through duties such as playground supervision, school camps and excursions
- Participate actively in staff meetings, professional development workshops, curriculum planning, and school-wide initiatives
- Supervise student teachers on placement, offering mentorship, feedback, and professional guidance.

- Minimum 2 years of full-time teaching experience in a secondary school setting.
